Appropriate Business Casual Attire

Business casual wear isn't as formal as the classic full business suit, but it still renders a business-like impression. Below is a quick guide of acceptable garments:

- Slacks or business dress pants, khakis, chinos, knee-length skirts, dark jeans without holes
- Button-down shirts, sweaters, blouses, henleys or polo shirts
- Knee-length or maxi dresses
- Optional cardigans, blazers or sport coats
- Closed-toed shoes such as loafers, Oxfords, boots, pumps or flats
